

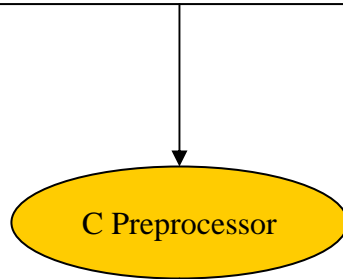

The gcc Command

```
#include <stdio.h>
int main(void)
/* Print "hello, world\n" to stdout. */
{
    printf("hello, world\n");
    return 0;
}
```

hello.c
Source code
C language
Contains preprocessor directives



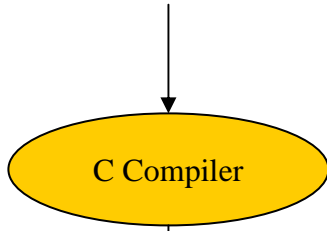
Preprocess
gcc -E hello.c > hello.i

```
...
int printf(char *format, ...);
...
int main(void)
{
    printf("hello, world\n");
    return 0;
}
```

hello.i
Source code
C language
Contains declaration of printf function
Missing definition of printf function

Compile

```
gcc -Wall -ansi -pedantic -S hello.i
```

```
.section .rodata
pcGreeting:
.string "hello, world\n"
.section .text
.globl main
.type main,@function
main:
    pushl %ebp
    movl %esp, %ebp
    pushl $pcGreeting
    call printf
    addl $4, %esp
    movl $0, %eax
    movl %ebp, %esp
    popl %ebp
    ret
```

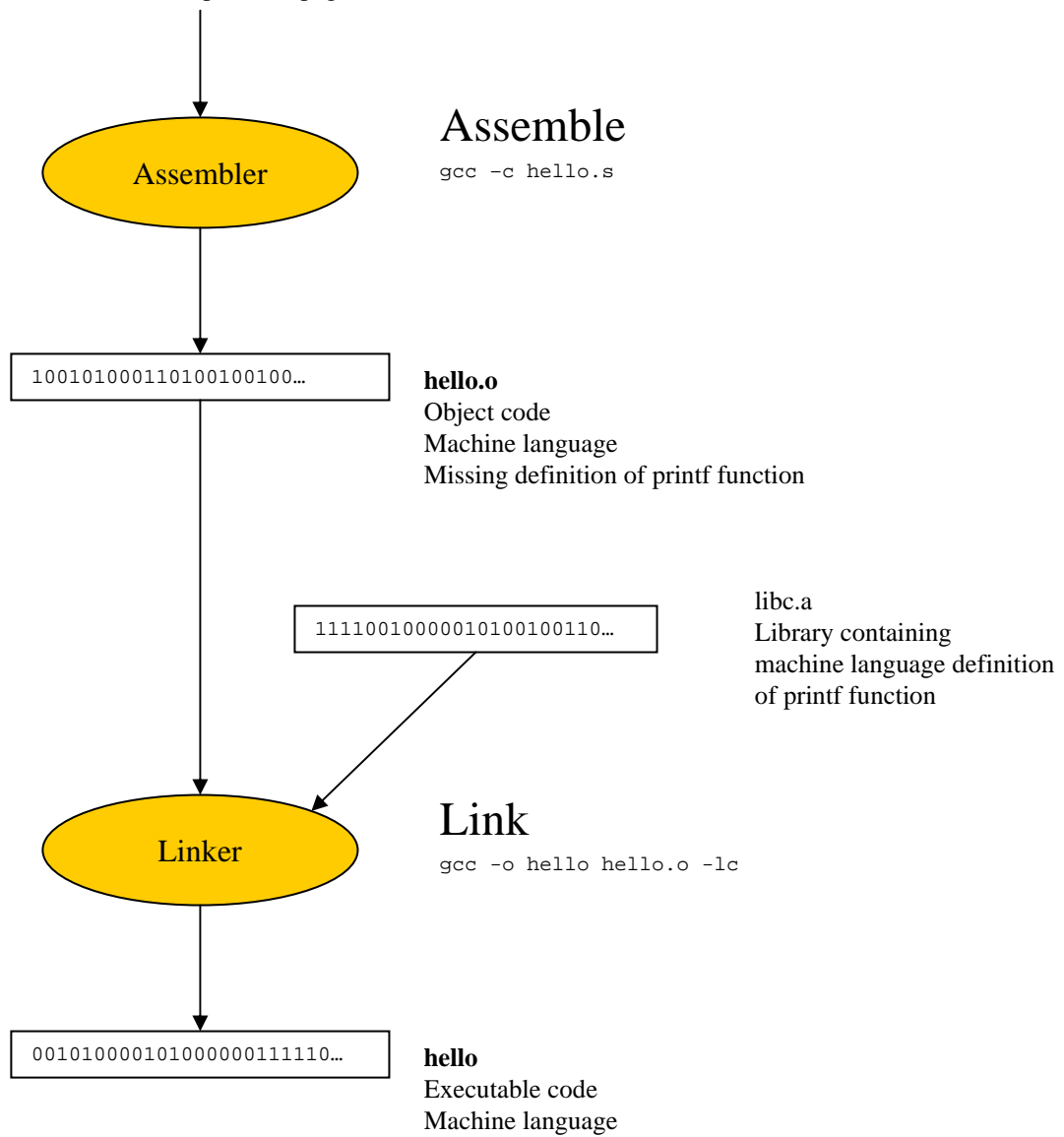
